## Children's Reports

## Health and Wellbeing Day – 20<sup>th</sup> January

We are lucky enough to have a PE teacher coming into school and provide a full educational day for our children. It will begin with a whole school assembly promoting the importance of staying active and give our children ideas and suggestions on how they can stay active in and out of school. Each class will then take part in a practical fitness sessions and workshops all focusing on wellbeing.



## Bikeability – Year 5 & 6 – Mon 23 Jan to Thur 26 Jan

Year 5 & 6 will be able to partake in bikeability. All children will need their own bike (full working brakes) and helmet. Permission slips will be sent out prior to the sessions and these will need completing

electronically in order to participate.

## Attendance

Good attendance is key to your child being able to fulfil their potential and make good progress in school. One of the most important ways a parent can support the education of their child and ensure the child's social, emotional and academic development is to ensure they attend every day and on time. As you know, this can only be achieved if your child is attending school and has a good level of attendance. 96% attendance is regarded as the minimum acceptable level of attendance. In the New Year, we will endeavour to report to you more regularly if your child has weak attendance as we need to understand why your child attendance is below the national expectation and how this can be improved. As per this year, no holidays will be authorised and any unauthorised attendance will be referred to the Local Authority who may issue a fine to parents who have parental responsibility for the child. We appreciate that there are genuine reasons for absence and we have had genuine conversations with parents in regards to this but we must also address any attendance that falls below expectations in line with DfE and Durham County Council guidelines.

## Contact Details

If any of your details have changed recently can we please ask that you contact the school office. This could be a change of address, or a change of phone number or perhaps a change in emergency contact details. We will then update our school records accordingly. We need a minimum

of two contacts, for safeguarding purposes, to ensure we can make contact in an emergency. If you wish to change the names of people on the pick-up list please contact the school office.

### **Parking & School Access**

It should be **everyone's priority** to ensure parking is **safe, respectful** and **legal**.



Please try to adhere to these simple rules:

- Never Park on the yellow lines or any clear markings or safer crossing places, even for a few minutes;
- Never Park on pavements in a way which prevents pedestrians, disabled users or parents with prams/pushchairs from using the pavement;
- Try not to convene near the school gates as this is how children and parents access the school.

When children are using any of the 3 school crossing patrol sites in Ushaw Moor can you please ensure your child dismounts from their bicycle or scooter and walks across the road. This is for the child's safety.

### **Reading**

We listen to your children read in school and have also invested in Reading Plus for our older children, but we are asking for your support in ensuring your child reads for 10 minutes a day at home, to maximise their reading progress. Reading each day really makes a difference on developing your child's vocabulary, their fluency as well as helping them with ideas in their writing tasks. For our pupils in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2, it is vital that your child brings their reading book and reading record to school every day as staff will read frequently on a 1:1 basis with your child and record in their reading record any words or sounds they are struggling with so you can help them at home. We ask parents to sign and date when you hear your child read at home and make a positive comment. We will shortly be sending out Reading for Pleasure books with the younger children. These are books that they have chosen and are intended for you to read to them. This will help them with the structure of stories, vocabulary and language. Remember to get really involved and do the voices or a dance if necessary!

### **Reading Plus**

Our KS2 children, (years 3-6) are now using the Reading Plus program to help become better readers. Reading Plus helps children develop the skills they need to be skilled readers and lifelong learners. The children seem to love it so please encourage them to read at home. Through regular Reading Plus practise, reading will become easier, and comprehension will increase. 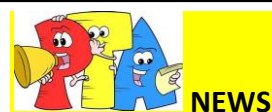
