Parking & School Access

Unfortunately, we have again received complaints regarding parents parking on the yellow lines near the school and of access being blocked to the school gates. Obviously, this is not an ideal situation as it is one that puts our children in danger.



It should be **everyone's priority** to ensure parking is **safe, respectful and legal**. Please try to adhere to these simple rules:

- Never Park on the yellow lines or any clear markings or safer crossing places, even for a few minutes;
- Never Park on pavements in a way which prevents pedestrians, disabled users or parents with prams/pushchairs from using the pavement;
- Try not to convene near the school gates as this is how children and parents access the school.

Reception and Year 6 - Height & Weight – 7th November

The school nurse will visit school on Monday the 7th to measure the height and weights of the reception and year 6 children. You should have received a letter with more information from your local council regarding this matter. On the day, trained staff will weigh your child and measure their height while they're in their clothes at school. They'll make sure the measurements are done sensitively and in private, and your child's results will not be shared with teachers or other children. Your child does not have to take part, but every child who's measured is contributing to the national picture about how children are growing. The more children who take part, the clearer that picture will be. The information collected helps your local NHS and local council plan and provide better health services for our area.

Reading

We listen to your children read in school and have also invested in Reading Plus for our older children, but we are asking for your support in ensuring your child reads for 10 minutes a day at home, to maximise their reading progress. Reading each day really makes a difference on developing your child's vocabulary, their fluency as well as helping them with ideas in their writing tasks. For our pupils in Reception, Year 1 & Year 2, it is vital that your child brings their reading book and reading record to school every day as staff will read frequently on a 1:1 basis with your child and record in their reading record any words or sounds they are struggling with so you can help them at home. We ask parents to sign and date when you hear your child read at home and make a positive comment. We will shortly be sending out Reading for Pleasure books with the younger children. These are books that they have chosen and are intended for you to read to them. This will help them with the structure of stories, vocabulary and language.

Remember to get really involved and do the voices or a dance if necessary!

Reading Plus


Our KS2 children, (years 3-6) are now using the Reading Plus program to help become better readers. Reading Plus helps children develop the skills they need to be skilled readers and lifelong learners. The children seem to love it so please encourage them to read at home. Through regular Reading Plus practise, reading will become easier, and comprehension will increase. 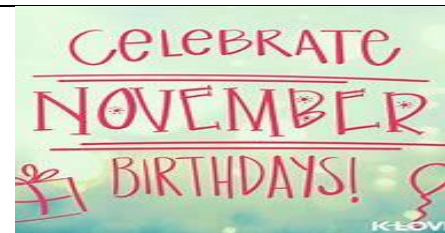
