Christmas Post Box

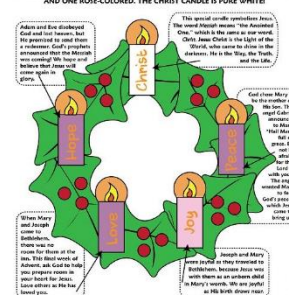
From Monday 5th December, our Christmas Post Box will be available in the hall so that the children can send cards to others in the school. All cards must be clearly labelled with the name (surname too if possible) and class. Children in class 4 will deliver the cards to the children daily at the end of the school day. Class lists are available from the school office from Santa's helper (Mrs Bowron).

Advent

On Sunday, it will be the first Sunday of Advent. Advent is a call to followers of Christ to remember the birth of Jesus.

The word advent stems from a Latin word that means "coming" or "arrival." Its purpose is to help believers remain focused on the birth of Christ and Jesus' glorious return as the real reason to celebrate Christmas. The Advent season is divided into four weeks, and each week features a different liturgical theme. Traditionally, the first week remembers the hope and expectation of the Jewish people as they looked forward to the Saviour's arrival — and it also reminds believers today to wait expectantly for Jesus' second coming. The second week focuses on preparation: Over many centuries, God prepared the hearts of the Jews for Christ's coming, just as He is now working in our hearts to prepare us for Christ's second coming. The third week joyfully celebrates the coming of the Messiah, and the final week celebrates God's peace and love – a time when we begin to prepare for the coming of Jesus. We will be celebrating Advent in school with the children and now you can explain when they ask you questions!

THE COLOR OF ADVENT IS PURPLE. THERE ARE THREE PURPLE ADVENT CANDLES, AND ONE ROSE-COLORED. THE CHRIST CANDLE IS PURE WHITE.

- Tinned meat (stewing steak, ham, mince, corned beef, hot dogs etc.)
- Instant coffee, dilute orange, instant hot chocolate, tea bags
- Sugar, spray cooking oil
- Lentil or leek & potato tinned soup
- Tinned rice pudding, custard or large tins of evaporated milk
- Tinned potatoes and vegetables
- Dried rice/noodle meals (just add water)
- Toilet rolls, cleaning products

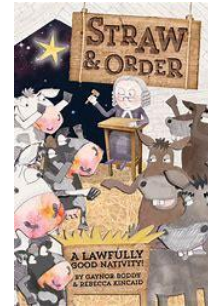
Concert by violin children – Monday 5th December

Our children will be performing their Christmas Play – Straw and Order - in church on Wednesday 7th at 10am and on Thursday 8th at 6pm to all their families. Tickets are available from Mrs Bowron but due to demand and seating in church we can only provide each family with 2 tickets. Once these have been distributed we will draw names out of a hat for remaining tickets.



Can I please remind you all that this is the first really big whole school event that we have undertaken in nearly 3 years and some of our children are a little nervous and apprehensive. I know you will support and encourage them on the day and night and more importantly love every minute.

To help with the nerves and so that all visitors can hear, as well as giving more room, we are asking (just as we did during Covid times) that no babies or children are brought to the productions. Thank you for your understanding with this.

Prior to the upcoming Christmas performances, it is necessary that guidance is given related to videos, photography and sharing of images. It is preferable that you DO NOT take photographs or video during the performance. If you do photograph your child, please ensure it is only your child and remember you are not permitted to share images of children, other than your own, on any social media.

I know that you will want to ensure that the safety and welfare of all children is protected by this arrangement. Thank you in advance for your support and cooperation in this matter.
