Children's Mental Health Week - (6th-12th February)

Federation Polar Day – 7th February

The children from Year 2 at both, Our Lady Queen of Martyrs and St Joseph's will join together at St Joseph's to meet a member of a polar expedition team. They will learn how to survive in extreme conditions. They will have the opportunity to ask questions about this expedition and to try some of the equipment and food they took with them. We would like children to attend with warm clothing (tracksuit bottoms) and suitable footwear as part of the day will be outside and they will need to access the grass which may be muddy. However, your child will still be required to wear a school jumper/cardigan.

Safer Internet Day – 8th February

As usual, we will be learning about Online Safety on Wednesday 8th February. The theme is 'Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online'. This year's focus is on asking parents, carers, teachers, government, policymakers, and the wider online safety industry to take time to listen to children and young people and make positive change together. Online Safety is part of our ongoing curriculum teaching and we do not focus on it just on this day. Far from it!

Northern Ballet Workshop – Year 1 & 2 – 27th February

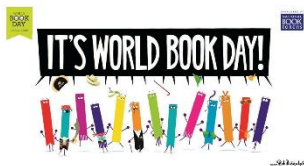

They will enjoy a specialist ballet class linked to The Ugly Ducking which will be performed at the Gala Theatre on 4th & 5th April. Unfortunately, this falls during our Easter break and we will not be able to attend as a school. This workshop is the first part of the children working towards a Discover Art Award.

Little Rescuers First Aid - Year 1 & 5 – 28th February

Our Year 5 and Year 1 children will begin a five-week first aid course after half term. Little Rescuers teaches children the life-saving skills of first aid, taught in a fun and engaging way, through games, music and teamwork. It is fantastic and a life skill we should all know.



World Book Day – 2nd March



Costumes at the ready! Come dressed as any character from a story. World book day's mission is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young person the opportunity to have a book of their own. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income. We want to see more children with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them. The World Book Day organisation will be providing gift vouchers to ensure that all children can have a book of their own.

Year Five and Six Residential Trip

A two-night stay has been arranged with [Wilderness Safari Camp in the Durham Dales](#) during the week of 22nd May. It offers a wide range of adventurous activities, and your children are sure to create memories they will treasure for years to come. All activities are run by a team of highly qualified and experienced outdoor practitioners. If your child is interested in going, please can you register their interest at the office as cost is dependent on numbers. Deposits of £50 are required for a place by **Thursday 16th February**. As in the past a saving scheme will be set up in school to allow families to pay for the trip gradually. If you have any questions at all regarding this matter, please phone the school.

Morning Registration

All children need to be in class by 8.55am for registration and house groups. Our gates open at 8:45am to allow everyone time to get into school safely in a timely manner. During this time children are provided with free bagels and have the opportunity of a soft landing into school ready to begin academic work promptly at 9am. During the time between 8.45-9am, individual pupils are also taken out to read. This is a pivotal time in school so please ensure your child is in on time in order they start their day in a positive manner.

Attendance

Good attendance is key to your child being able to fulfil their potential and make good progress in school. One of the most important ways a parent can support the education of their child and ensure the child's social, emotional and academic development is to ensure they attend every day *and on time*. As you know, this can only be achieved if your child is attending school and has a good level of attendance. 96% attendance is regarded as the minimum acceptable level of attendance. As stated in the last newsletter, we have begun to contact parents whose child/children have weak attendance as we need to understand why your child's attendance is below the national expectation and how this can be improved. As in previous years, no holidays will be authorised and any unauthorised attendance will be referred to

the Local Authority who may issue a fine to each parent who has parental responsibility for the child. We appreciate that there are genuine reasons for absence and we have had conversations with parents in regards to this but we must also address any attendance that falls below expectations in line with DfE and Durham County Council guidelines.

Contact Details

If any of your details have changed recently can we please ask that you contact the school office. This could be a change of address, or a change of phone number or perhaps a change in emergency contact details. We will then update our school records accordingly. We need a minimum of two contacts, for safeguarding purposes, to ensure we can make contact in an emergency. If you wish to change the names of people on the pick-up list, please contact the school office.
